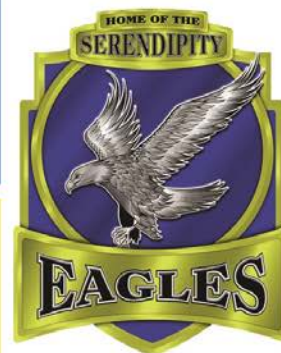

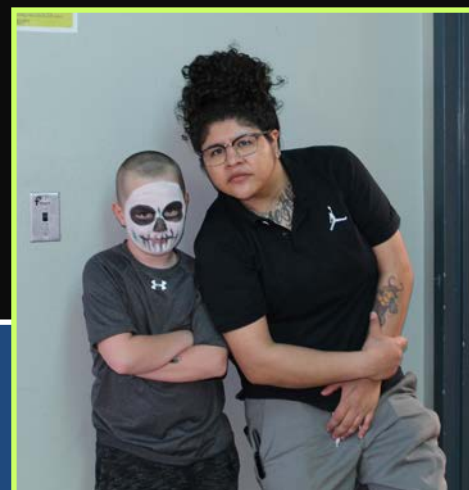

Students Enjoy a Hard-Earned PBIS Game Day!

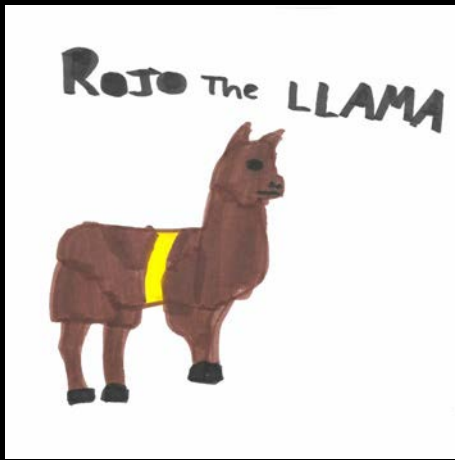

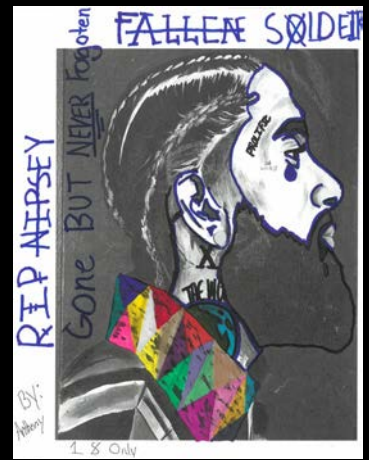

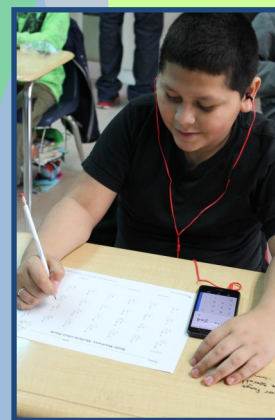
